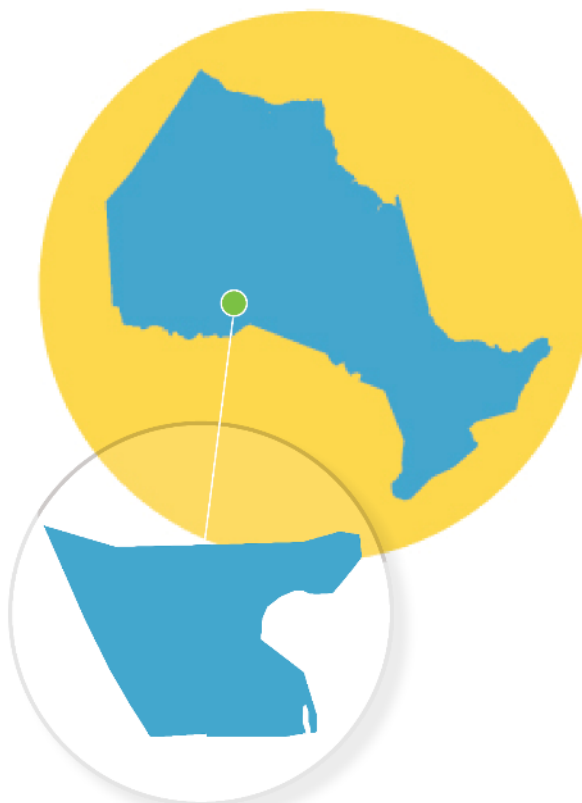
A Snapshot of NIPIGON

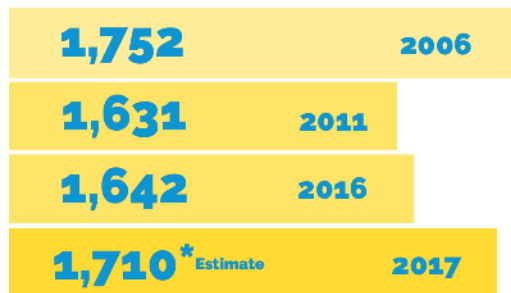

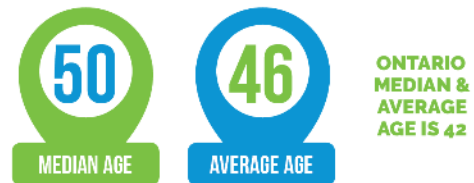

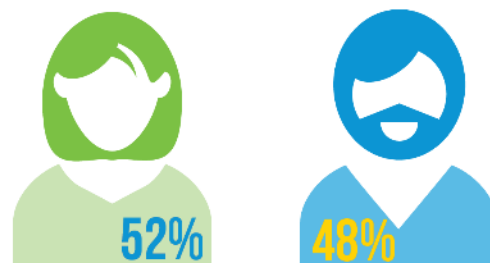

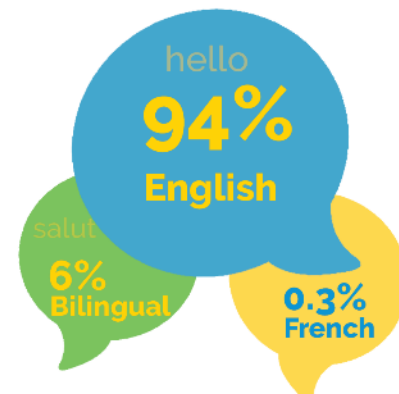

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Economic History

The Township of Nipigon has a long history of tourism, beginning with world-famous sport fishing from the 1870s to the 1930s, later enhanced by the establishment of rail and road networks. Situated among one million hectares of fresh water, with over 70 species of freshwater fish, it is the home of the world record Brook Trout caught in 1915 in the Nipigon River.

Historically, Nipigon's industry has consisted mainly of forestry, fishing, and tourism. Forestry, initiated in the late 1800s/early 1900s, continued in various forms including operation of mills beginning in the 1930s in both Nipigon (until 2007) and Red Rock (until 2006).

There is a history of Finnish immigration to Nipigon, which remains a strong part of the community's identity. Commercial fisheries have been around perhaps as early as the 1830s.

1.2 Location

The Township of Nipigon is located within the Thunder Bay District of Northwestern Ontario. It is located 797 km from Winnipeg, and 110 km from Thunder Bay.

With ease of accessibility the Township is situated just on Trans-Canada Highway 16.

Nipigon is conveniently located at the intersection of Highway 11 and Highway 17, north of Lake Superior. Within this ideal location, Nipigon benefits from a crystal blue lake shore, and pristine wilderness. For example, the Township is located only 115 kilometers from Thunder Bay, and 175 kilometers from U.S. Customs and Border Protection - Grand Portage Port of Entry.

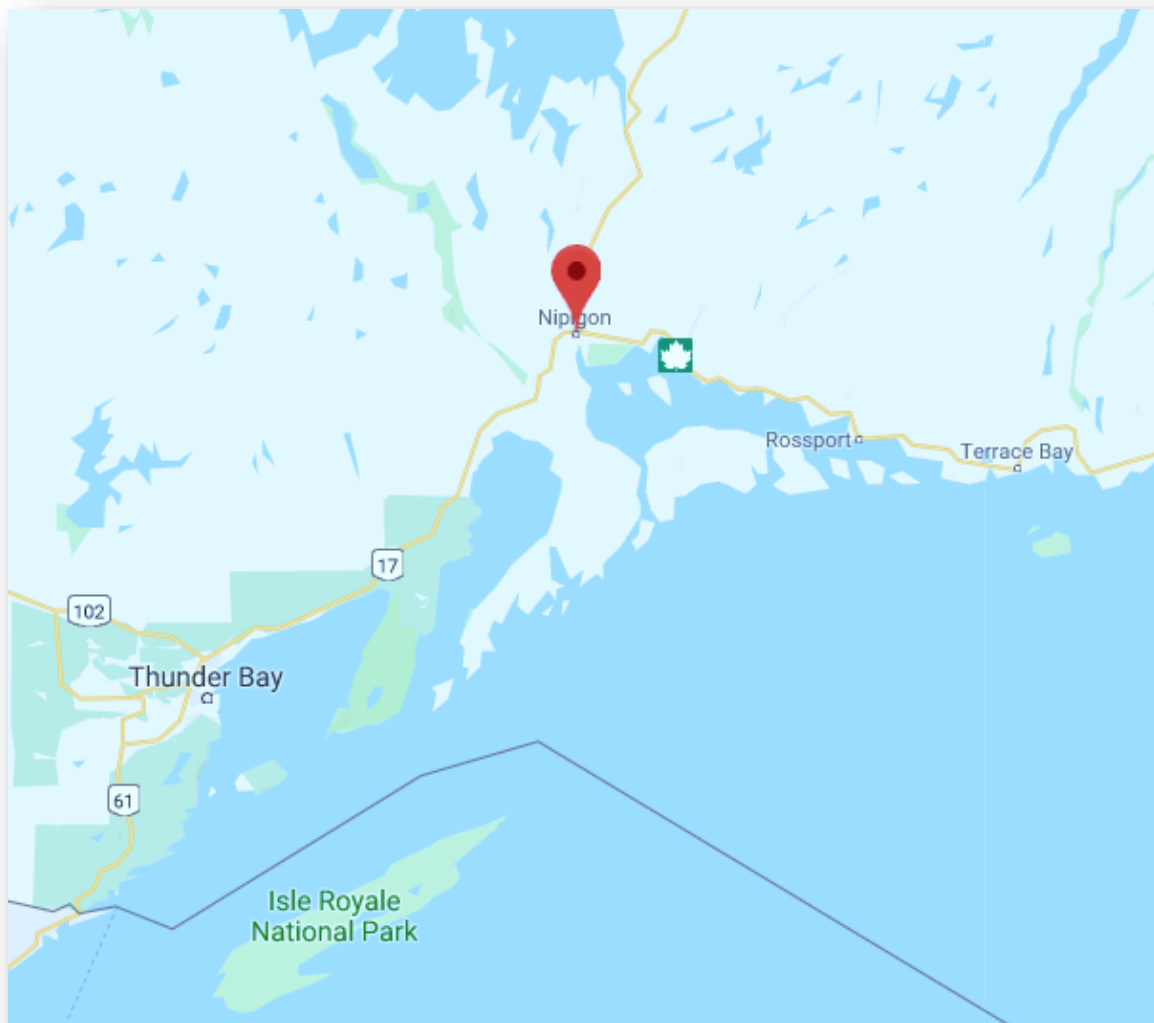


Figure 2: Nipigon Local Map

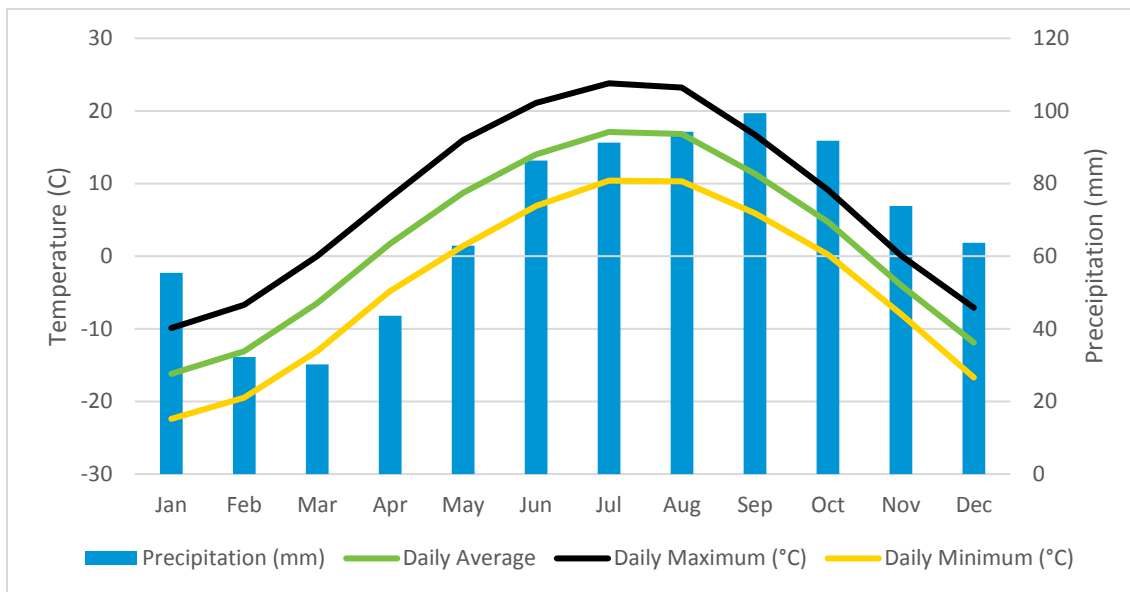

2.2 Age Profile



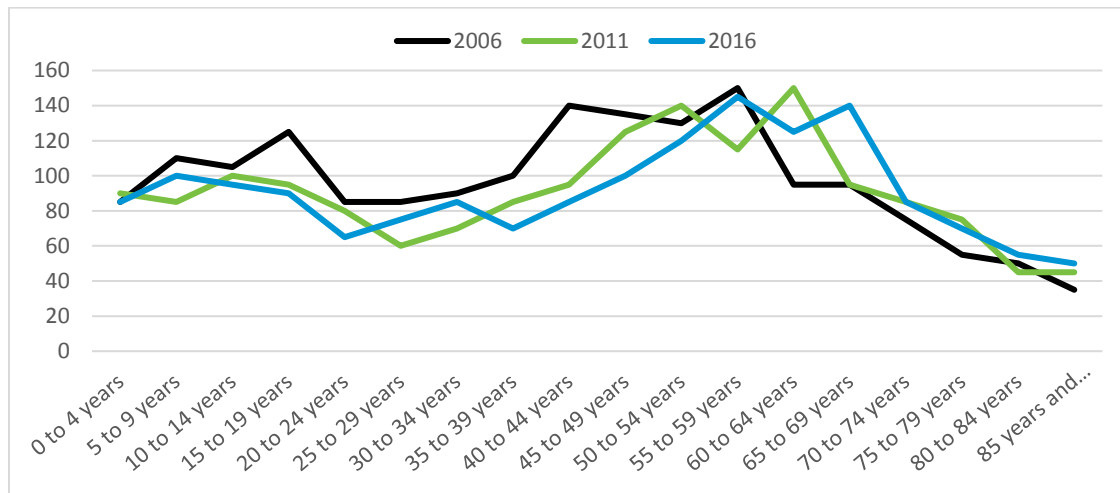
In 2017, the Township of Nipigon had an older population than the province. Figure 4 shows a larger portion of the population in the Township of Nipigon is 60 or older, compared to the province.

Furthermore, the median age in the Township of Nipigon was 44, compared to 39 in Ontario, and the average age was 45 compared to the provincial figure of 40.

2.3 Language Characteristics

Table 4 indicates nearly 94% of the residents in the Township of Nipigon speak English only, which is above the provincial figure (86%).

Approximately 6% of the population in the Township speaks both English and French.

2.4 Mobility Characteristics

Table 5 indicates that residents in the Township of Nipigon are less likely to change place of residence within or five years, compared to the province. Estimates indicate those moving to the Township of Nipigon tend to relocate from within the province rather than outside of Ontario or Canada.

Within the category of movers, a further distinction is made between non-migrants and migrants; this difference is called migration status.

² Non-movers are persons who, on Census Day, were living at the same address as the one at which they resided one year earlier.

³ Movers are persons who, on Census Day, were living at a different address from the one at which they resided one year earlier.

⁴ Non-migrants are movers who, on Census Day, were living at a different address, but in the same census subdivision (CSD) as the one they lived in one year earlier.

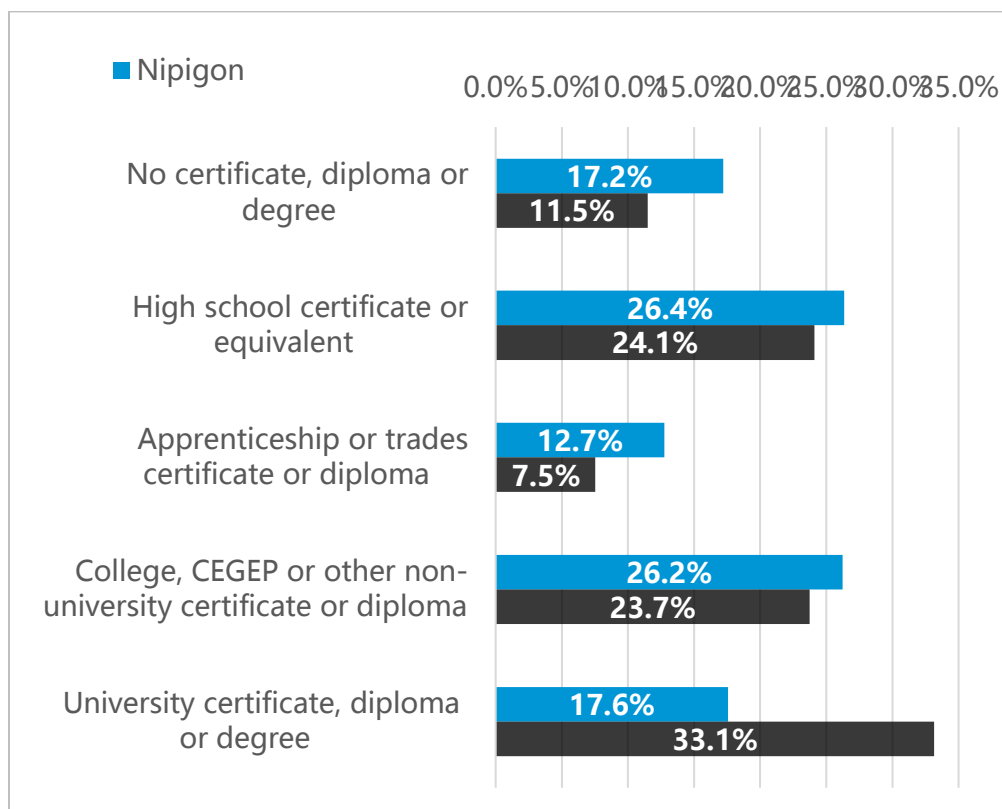

2.5 Level of Education

Figures 5 and 6, and Table 6 indicate the level of educational attainment in 2016:

- Over 83% of residents in Township of Nipigon, and Ontario (88%) have a certificate, diploma or degree.
- Township of Nipigon has more (26%) College, CEGEP or other non-university certificates compared to Ontario (24%).
- The Township of Nipigon has more college, apprenticeship or trades certificates/diplomas, compared to the province.

2.6 Income

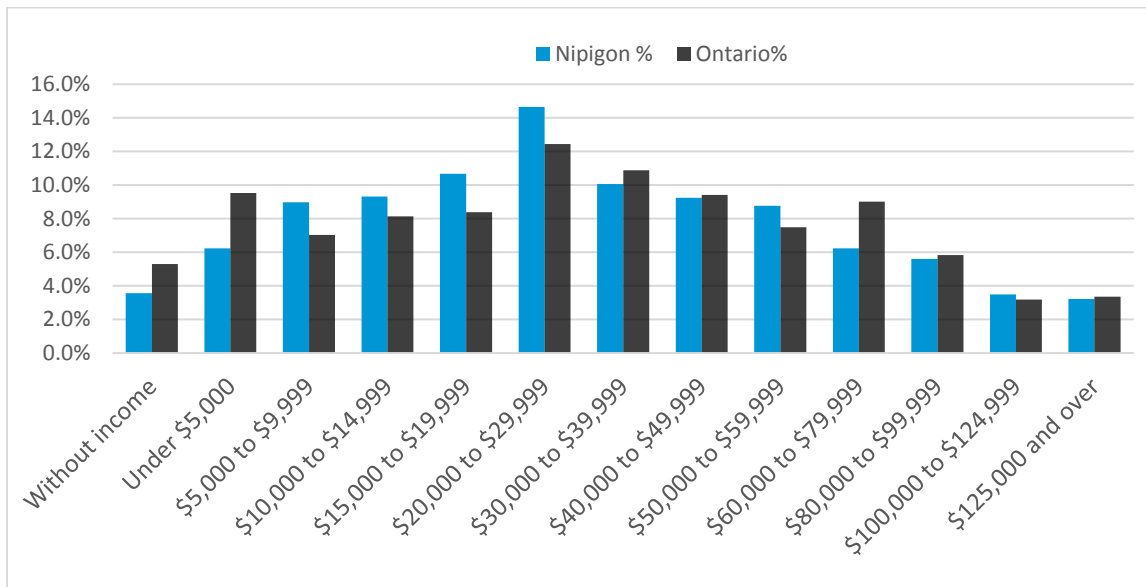

Figure 7 below shows that Nipigon's income distribution is more equitable than the province's. That is, there are more persons living with incomes at the center of the distribution, and less living at the extremes, compared to Ontario.

3. LABOUR FORCE

3.1 Key Indicators

The Township of Nipigon is home to a labour force that is 875 persons. As illustrated in Table 10, the community participation and employment rates are below that of Ontario. The unemployment rate is comparable to that of Ontario.

⁹ Participation rate - Refers to the labour force expressed as a percentage of the population 15 years and over excluding institutional residents. Employment rate - Refers to the number of persons employed expressed as a percentage of the total population 15 years and over excluding institutional residents. Unemployment rate - Refers to the unemployed expressed as a percentage of the labour force.

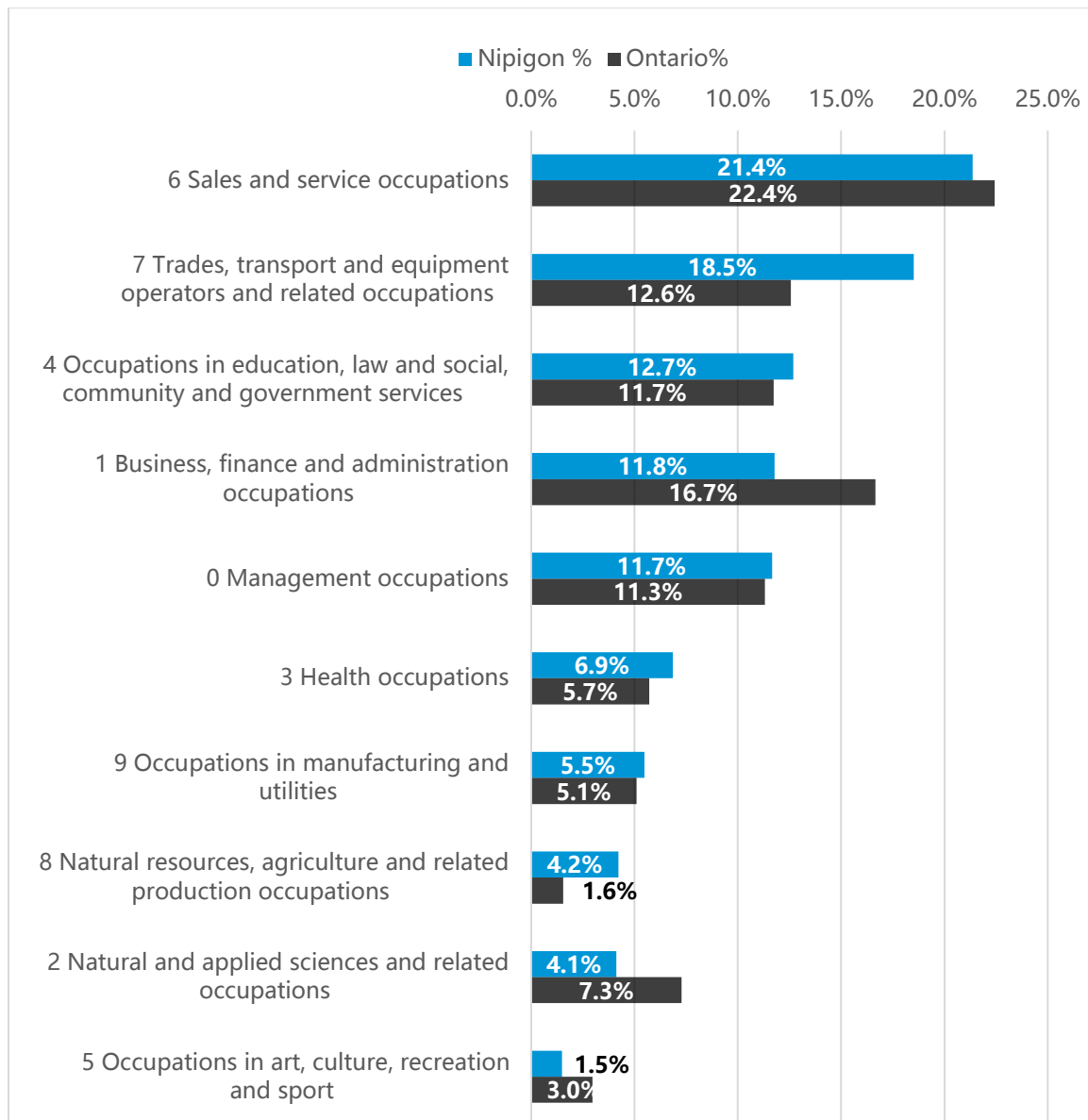


3.2 Labour Force by Occupation

Based on Figure 10 and Table 11, the following can be said about Nipigon's labour force make up by occupation:

- Sales and service occupations represent the largest occupational group (21%) in the community.
- The following occupations are of interest because they are more concentrated in Nipigon relative to Ontario:
 - Business, finance and administration occupations;
 - Health occupations;
 - Natural and applied sciences and related occupations; and
 - Occupations in art, culture, recreation and sport.

3.3 Labour Force by Industry

4. TRANSPORTATION AND SHIPPING

4.1 Highways

Township of Nipigon's main connecting roads are:

- Highway 11, which connects North Eastern Ontario with North Western Ontario.
- Highway 17, running east-west through the province and linking it with Winnipeg and Montreal.
- Highway 61, running south of Thunder Bay, connects the region with US markets.

Ontario Highways 11 and 17 lie within 15 minutes drive of the tip of Township of Nipigon. These highways provide access points to the province's 400-series; highways that lead to Southern Ontario and the United States, west to the Québec-Windsor Corridor, and west into Manitoba.

Through these access routes, the Township of Nipigon can truck to 100% of Ontario's industrial market in just one day.

8.5 Events and Attractions

- **Paddle-to-the-Sea Park and Splash Pad** brings the adventurous story of a journey through the Great Lakes to life! Starting at the Lake Superior waterfall in the heart of downtown Nipigon, twelve playground stations lead you on a journey of fun through town to the waterfront.
- **World class fishing** can be found at the very top of the great lakes in every season. The Nipigon River is about 48 km (30 miles) long and 50 to 200 m (165 to 656 ft) wide. There are also many lakes and rivers in the area known for great fishing, including Fraser Lake, the Black Sturgeon River, Jackfish River or the Gravel River. Check with the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources for limits and species restrictions wherever you fish.
- **Nipigon Marina** is the most northerly freshwater port in North America. With a deep-water channel all the way to the fully serviced marina, boaters are invited to cross the 49th parallel and receive their certificate commemorating the occasion.
- **Nipigon River Recreation Trail** is a 10km hiking trail, which connects the Nipigon and Red Rock marinas, takes between 3-4 hours to complete and is rated with a blue difficulty rating, with some middle portions being rated as black diamond.
- **Mazukama Falls Hiking Trail** This day hike has been described as magical. The challenging 3.1 km loop trail will take 1.5-2 hrs to complete as it climbs steeply for 500 m and passes beside the cascades and waterfalls of Mazukama Creek as it tumbles off the red rocks of Kama Cliffs through huge old growth cedars
- **Historical Walking Tour:** Archaeological evidence indicates that people may have lived in the Nipigon area for 9000 years. In the more recent past, rock paintings on the mouth of the Nipigon River show an Aboriginal presence and predate European contact by several hundred years.
