Activity Maps have been created for communities all around the globe. The one common element in all of these maps are the icons used to illustrate the various points of interest.

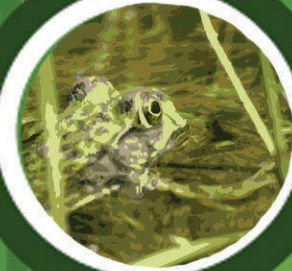
What is on my Activity Map?
